It is important practitioners work together, ask questions and reflect on the information received to create safer cultures.

To achieve safer cultures and communities, practitioners and members of the community should be professionally curious. This involves looking, listening, asking direct questions and reflecting on **all** of the information received. Practitioners need to be recognising signs that harm could be occurring, asking questions to learn more about what is happening and talking to others within and outside of the organisational context, where necessary, to follow-up concerns.
