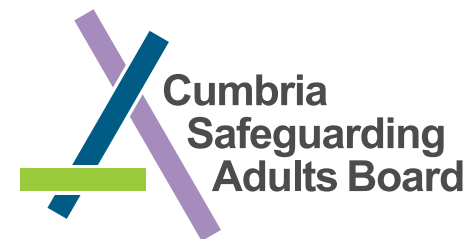


# What's happening in Cumbria during National Safeguarding Adults Week 2024?
